<b>What if we didn't exist?</b>						If the coalition did not exist there would be no formal structure for the stakeholders to continue to assess education, prevention, treatment, and recovery needs of individuals and families affected by substance use disorder. Without the Coalition there would exist no island-wide mechanism to identify, discuss, and remediate gaps in education, prevention, treatment, and recovery resources for the island community. Further, the Coalition provides a forum to discuss emerging trends and practices for any new challenging situations. The Coalition relies on a dedicated staff position to collect data, organize meetings and associated activities, energize sub-committees or groups engaged in problem-specific activity, and involve critically important stakeholder organizations in system and service development. The Coalition is a vital entity to apply for grants that require community collaboration, aggregate data, and joint effort in providing								
<b>Benefits</b>						By having the stakeholders meeting regularly the island issues surrounding SUD can be addressed in collaborative manner, bringing coordination and more efficiency and effectiveness in the areas of education, prevention, treatment, recovery supports and harm reduction due to misuse of alcohol and drugs.
